


Mission Action Plan 2025-2030

## The History

St George's Parish was carved out of the parish of Christ Church, East Greenwich in the 1890s and the building was completed and consecrated on 23<sup>rd</sup> January 1892. Situated on the slopes of Westcombe Park in southeast London, the building and the church within it have a strong history of community engagement and social action. It has never been a large church and its history is one of threat of closure due to lack of funds at various times throughout the last (nearly) 150 years. That said, there has always been something special and unique about the church at St George's and it is has always continued to serve the community through the grace of God and the dedication of its congregation.

St George's is now part of the Parish of East Greenwich, with sister churches in Christ Church - East Greenwich and Holy Trinity -Greenwich Peninsula. The three churches all bring something unique to the parish, and work together whilst maintaining their distinct identities.

A strength of St George's has always been its people, and it has a long history of working for inclusion and for the love of God to be known by all, especially those who might otherwise be at the margins of the church. St George's has formally been an inclusive church for a number of years and continues to work for the inclusion of all.

A big challenge for us is the building itself, which needs significant work to be completed to it to enable it to continue to serve the community and serve as a place of worship. We want to continue to be a place of gentle healing for those who have been hurt by the wider church and a place for everyone to know that their whole identity is created and loved by God. St George's is well thought of in the community and needs to build on this history of community engagement and support.

It is on the foundation of this history that this mission action plan has been drawn up.

#### **Inclusive Church**

St George's is committed to being an inclusive church and subscribes fully to the statement of faith from the Inclusive Church network.

"We believe in **inclusive church** – a church which **celebrates and affirms every person** and does not discriminate.

We will continue to challenge the church where it continues to discriminate against people on grounds of disability, economic power, ethnicity, gender, gender identity, learning disability, mental health, neurodiversity, or sexuality.

We believe in a Church which **welcomes and serves all people** in the name of Jesus Christ; which is scripturally faithful; which seeks to proclaim the Gospel afresh for each generation; and which, in the power of the Holy Spirit, allows all people to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Jesus Christ."

### **Areas of Mission**

The four initial areas of mission were agreed following a PCC Away Day in November 2023, and St George's has added a fifth of 'Facilitating' to encompass the way that the building facilitates all that we undertake and the importance of repairing, preserving and developing it and making sure there is an inclusive community of faith here for generations to come.
